RESOLUTION NO. 613

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF UNIVERSITY PLACE, WASHINGTON, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO PURSUE AND EXPRESSING COUNCIL SUPPORT FOR FEDERAL FUNDING TO ADDRESS PUBLIC HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES CAUSED BY FAILING SEPTIC SYSTEMS; AND TO SIMULTANEOUSLY PROVIDE NECESSARY SEWER EXTENSIONS AND CAPACITY UPGRADES TO ACCOMMODATE GROWTH ASSOCIATED WITH THE UP TOWN CENTER DOWNTOWN REVITALIZATION PROJECT.

WHEREAS, Since incorporation of the City of University Place in 1996, approximately 25% of the property within the City's boundaries is served by septic tank systems, many of them exceeding 30 years in age, and requiring continuous maintenance, experiencing repeated failures, and imminently jeopardizing public health and environmental integrity; and

WHEREAS, The citizens, Council, and staff of the City of University Place, the neighboring City of Fircrest, Pierce County Council, Pierce County Wastewater Treatment Division staff, and the Tacoma Pierce County Health Department participated in numerous studies to identify solutions to resolve public health and environmental issues arising from failing septic systems; and

WHEREAS, Without federal financial participation, the financial requirements of the Utility Local Improvement District laws make conversion from septic to sewer service unrealistic and cost prohibitive to the citizens of University Place; and

WHEREAS, The City of University Place's UP Town Center downtown revitalization, transitoriented project, which has already benefited from federal transportation funding, satisfies numerous sustainable economic development and job creation goals for the City, while providing essential longterm revenue generating benefits to its citizens; and

WHEREAS, The City is currently constructing the central business area of UP Town Center known as "Market Square," and expansion of the City's sewer infrastructure capacity is essential to accommodate anticipated residential and commercial growth in this location.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF UNIVERSITY PLACE, WASHINGTON AS FOLLOWS:

That the City Council, through the City Manager, will pursue federal funding to address public health and environmental issues and to provide necessary sewer extensions and capacity upgrades.
