WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 1.35.050 of the University Place Municipal Code, directives to the City's Commissions are to be in the form of a City Council Resolution; and

WHEREAS, each year the City Council has reviewed the preliminary work plan of the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the City Council now desires to approve said work plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF UNIVERSITY PLACE, WASHINGTON, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Adoption of the 2019 Annual Preliminary Public Safety Commission Work Plan. The City Council directs the Public Safety Advisory Commission to review and make recommendations regarding those items listed in the 2019 Annual Preliminary Public Safety Advisory Commission Work Plan attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

Public Safety Advisory Commission

Work Plan 2019 - 2020

Public Safety Commission mission statement:

The Public Safety Commission will work collaboratively and proactively to address public safety concerns in University Place. Through City Council interaction and public education, the Commission strives to promote and enhance public safety awareness to the citizens of University Place.

Commission Scope and Intent:

"City Council commissions provide a community sounding board and focus group to originate ideas and assist the City Council in fashioning legislative policy. Commissions are exclusively advisory to the City Council. Commissions may not take independent action representing the City with other agencies or bodies, and do not direct or duplicate the work of the City's administration."

Work Plan (Overall Concept):

The Public Safety Commission will focus efforts over the next biennium primarily in support of the following City Council Goals:

- 4) Conduct a detailed review of public safety needs with commission, community, and business input and develop long range planning document.
- 5) Complete and implement action plans for the Subarea Plans.
- 7) Explore partnering with UPSD to do an advisory bond measure to hire additional police officers for school and neighborhood safety.
- 12) Develop a policy for prioritizing one time and excess revenues to support police and transportation based on identified planning document.

The Public Safety Commission will devote secondary efforts, as time permits or the Council directs, to the following City Council Goals:

- 2) Implement an electronic citizens/public communications strategy.
- 3) Hold citywide 25-year celebration that will highlight accomplishments and solicit future needs/expectations.
- 10) Understand and define citizen involvement and value of volunteers/events on community image and desirability.
- 14) Establish a viable homeless action plan and partner with existing services.

The Public Safety Commission will approach the primary goals in a three-phase process. Each phase will result in a written product for City Council review and refined direction.

Phase 2 - Validation and Collaboration

Phase 3 – Resourcing Policy Development

The Phase 2 and 3 goals and outcomes will be revisited following the completion of Phase 1
